I. Welcome/Introductions

II. Introduction—Amber Newby, Project Coordinator Dr. Ford introduced Amber Newby as CoAPT's Project Coordinator. Ms. Newby's first day on the job was October 24.

III. Updates from Last Meeting

Law enforcement officials will look into being able to come speak/make and appearance to the students at the lock-in. Ms. Newby will keep CoAPT members and volunteers informed as to updates.
